

John Bee Holmes, 1760-1827

1760	Born in Charleston to Isaac Holmes, Jr., merchant, and Rebecca Bee
ca. 1779-1780	Served in the South Carolina Militia as aide-de-camp to General John Barnwell
1780	Arrested and imprisoned on British ship, the <i>Pack Horse</i>
1783	Married Elizabeth Edwards with whom he had twelve children
1783	Admitted to the bar
1787-1792	Served as recorder (judge) for the City of Charleston
1791-1797	Represented Charleston in the South Carolina General Assembly
1794-1795	Served as intendant of the City of Charleston
1799-1801	Served in the South Carolina State Senate
1827	Death and burial at the Circular Congregational Church
