Aside from the chance to learn the game of golf, caddying offers many other life-changing opportunities.

Caddie Benefits

Enjoy Flexible Hours and Great Money

Caddying provides flexibility so that you can earn a part-time income while continuing to be involved in school, sports and other summer activities.

Exposure to Positive Role Models

Many of the people you will caddie for are successful professionals and community leaders. By spending time with them you will have the opportunity to learn about a wide variety of career paths and personalities.

Work Outside, Exercise and Have Fun

Aside from allowing you to work outdoors, caddying provides an excellent opportunity to improve your overall health and fitness. You will also be able to make friends with the other youth caddies.

Gain Valuable Life Skills

Learn the importance of teamwork, communication and perseverance while developing valuable leadership and people skills that you will carry with you all of your life.

Opportunity to be awarded a Chick Evans Caddie Scholarship

Currently, 1,100 caddies are enrolled at 22 leading universities on an Evans Scholarship. The scholarship covers full tuition and housing costs for up to four years of college and is an estimated value of \$125,000.



The Evans Scholarship Today



The Evans Scholars Foundation (ESF) awards full tuition and housing scholarships to high-achieving caddies with limited financial means. Established in 1930 by the Western Golf Association (WGA) and celebrated amateur golfer Charles “Chick” Evans Jr., the Foundation oversees the nation’s largest scholarship program for caddies.

Evans Scholars are enrolled at 22 leading universities nationwide including 17 where the Foundation operates a Scholarship House. A record 1,100 Evans Scholars are enrolled for the 2022-23 academic year.

With more families struggling to pay for college and a record number of caddies applying for the Evans Scholarship, Foundation leaders are expanding the Program nationwide. Annual program costs this year are \$27 million.

EVANS SCHOLARSHIP CRITERIA

To qualify, caddies must be nominated by their club and meet four requirements:

- **Strong caddie record:** Applicants must have caddied, successfully and regularly, for a minimum of two years and are expected to caddie at their sponsoring club the year they apply for the Scholarship. Our average 2023 recipients completed three to four years of service as a caddie with 165 rounds.
- **Excellent academics:** Applicants must have completed their junior year of high school with above a B average in college preparatory courses. Our most recent recipients averaged a 3.7 unweighted GPA.
- **Demonstrated financial need:** Applicants must clearly have a need for financial assistance.
- **Outstanding character:** Applicants must be outstanding in character, integrity and leadership.

The Evans Scholarship Today



The Evans Scholars Foundation has positioned itself as the nation's foremost authority on caddying. It has taken on the responsibility of growing the game of golf, while establishing and developing caddie programs nationwide.

More than 11,815 men and women have graduated as Evans Scholars.

- **We serve students from humble backgrounds:** Our Scholarship recipients come from homes where the average household income is \$70,000.
- **We leverage the Western Golf Association's prestigious tournaments:** Net proceeds from the NV5 Invitational presented by Old National Bank, Western Junior, Western Amateur and BMW Championship support the Foundation – and these events provide unique opportunities to market our program.
- **Our Scholars perform at a high level:** They maintain a cumulative 3.3 GPA and graduate at a rate of 95.6%.
- **We are truly national:** For 2022, we awarded Evans Scholarships to caddies from 25 states and Canada.

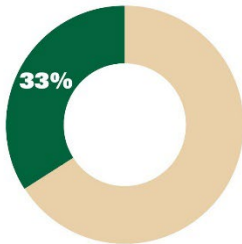

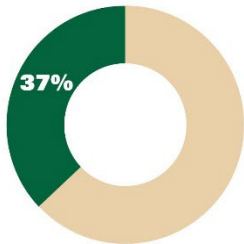

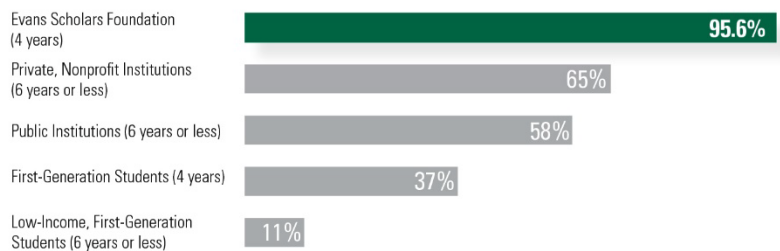


Program Outcomes



- We believe that the high performance of our Evans Scholars is driven by two unique factors: the life lessons acquired on the course as caddies and the strong support system that is afforded through community living.
- Evans Scholars graduate at a rate of 95.6%, significantly higher than national averages for the student populations our Program serves. After graduation, Evans Scholars are well-prepared to start building successful careers.

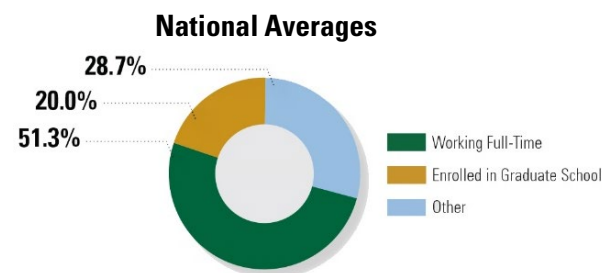
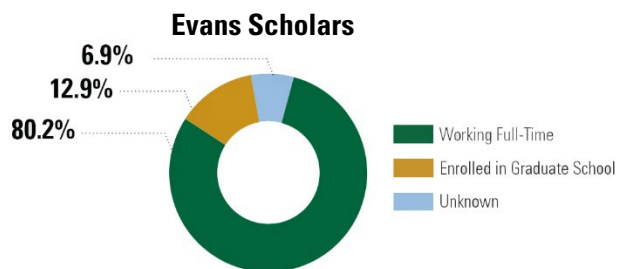

Program Efficiency & Funding

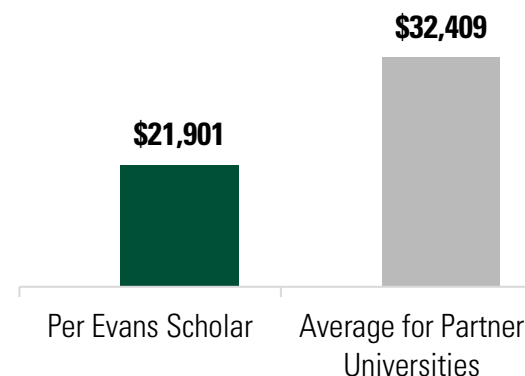


In addition to the academic success of the 1,100 young men and women enrolled in 22 leading universities nationwide, the Evans Scholars Foundation prides itself on maintaining an efficient operation.

Our net assets have grown by over \$50 million since 2010, indicating unprecedented financial strength as we prepare to bring the Evans Scholars Program to new universities, establish additional Scholarship Houses and send more caddies to college.

We work diligently to negotiate favorable rates with our partner universities, so the average tuition and housing cost per Evans Scholar is well below the approximate average cost of published full-price tuition and housing at our 22 partner universities..

Charleston Municipal Golf Course Youth Caddie Program



The Charleston Municipal Golf Course began a pilot youth caddie program in the summer of 2022 with young men and women from the area caddying on the weekend. Twelve students took part in the initial program.

For golfers at the Muni, walking with a youth caddie instead of using a cart is a unique experience that can't be found at other courses in the area.

"The opportunity for kids in this town is life-changing," said WGA Director Troy Miller, who led the renovation of the course in 2020 and helped implement the youth caddie program.



Charleston Municipal Golf Course Youth Caddie Program



Golfers can support Charleston Muni's youth caddie program by booking a caddie.

A base caddie fee of \$40 and lunch will be provided by the Western Golf Association. The WGA asks golfers to tip for good service. (Recommended tip for a good job for 18 holes is \$20)

Through the Evans Scholars Foundation, the Charleston Muni youth caddies could have a chance to qualify for a full tuition and housing scholarship to one of the partner universities.
