Parks Department

The Department of Parks is responsible for the design, construction, maintenance, and repairs of the City's new and existing parks, playgrounds, green spaces, facilities, and buildings.

The City currently owns & is responsible for:

- 120 parks, consisting of approx. 1,809 acres
- 211 buildings, totaling 3.67 million sq. ft

The Department of Parks is comprised of 4 specialized divisions:

- Administration
- Capital Projects
- Facilities Maintenance
- Grounds Management

Executive Department

Traffic & Transportation Department

- Studies, plans and implements traffic operations, transportation services, and facilities to maintain safe and efficient movement of people and goods throughout the City.
- Responsible for the planning, geometric configuration, and transportation operations of roads, streets, highways and all City property, their networks, terminals, abutting lands, and relationships with other modes of transportation.
- Seeks to continually increase the efficiency of all modes of transportation within the City by devising transportation related improvements in accordance with the City's broad policy requirements.



Clerk of Council



What is the Clerk of Council?

The Clerk of Council serves as an important link between City Council, the Mayor's Office, other City departments, and the public. The department provides administrative support to City Council, which includes setting and preparing agendas for Council and Standing Committee meetings, recording the minutes and votes at each meeting, and retaining the City's ordinances and ensuring that City laws are codified.

What the Clerk of Council does not do:

The Clerk of Council is often confused with the Clerk of Court. The Clerk of Court is with the County and deals with the filings of cases for various courts under the County's jurisdiction.

Important information for citizens:

How do I access meeting agendas and minutes?

Agendas and minutes for City Council, Ways and Means, and standing committees can be accessed on the City's website under "Government," followed by "Agendas and Minutes".

How do I sign-up to speak at a meeting or provide a comment for City Council?

Citizens can sign-up the day of the meeting by 5:00 p.m. to speak in person. Citizens can also sign-up online to speak or leave comments for City Council using the City's Innovate website (<https://innovate.charleston-sc.gov/>).

Online registration and comments must be submitted by noon, the Monday before Council.

How do I access the City's Code and research City Council Minutes?

The City's Code and Zoning Code can be accessed on <https://library.municode.com/sc/charleston>. Searchable City Council minutes are also available going back to 1975.

Housing & Community Development



Mission

The mission of the Department of Housing and Community Development (DHCD) is to create, facilitate, and implement activities and programs that stimulate community and economic development, expand the supply of affordable housing and stimulate the construction and rehabilitation of housing for persons of very low, low and moderate incomes in Charleston's neighborhoods.

The department has fourteen 14 staff members who undertake the work in administering programs and initiatives for the department.





Recreation Department



Stormwater Department

- Maintains the City's drainage system including stormwater inlets, pipes, channels, check valves, pump stations, and outfalls.
- Regulates new development and redevelopment projects to prevent flooding and improve areas with existing flooding and protect water quality.
- Constructs drainage improvement projects ranging in size from multiple neighborhoods to individual street scale.

Did you know the City has recently completed a deep tunnel drainage system more than 100' deep below US17 which will help drain hundreds of acres along the road corridor?

A new pump station will be constructed in the next 2 years between the bridges to West Ashley to further improve drainage performance on this system during high tide conditions.
