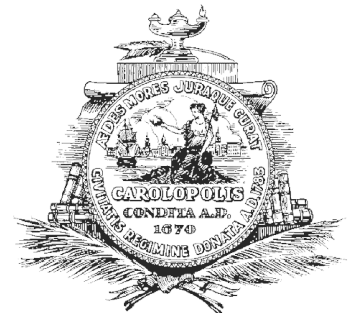

We were founded in 1973 initially as a way to preserve the neighborhood's residential community. Over the years, RNA has worked with developers and the City of Charleston to thoughtfully preserve single family homes, limit the number of large-scale apartment buildings and preserve the quality of life in our neighborhood. We focus on sharing information, connecting neighbors, promoting activities, and fostering civic involvement. We are the officially recognized voice concerning the neighborhood with the City and its departments and any other neighborhood associations.

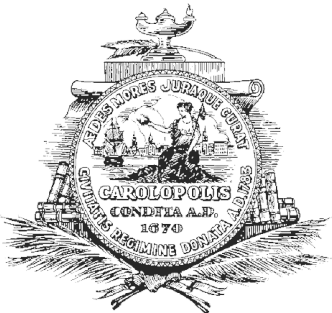

Over the past few years, RNA has helped residents voice their concerns to developers who wanted to build a parking garage on Warren Street, learn about proposed King Street changes and the Low Country Low Line. We hosted school board candidates as a way to give members a way to ask questions that matter to them. We created an information sheet for new residents to help acclimate them to city services and expectations. Today, our focus is on quality-of-life issues that come with living in a City with a bustling restaurant and night life – e.g., parking and trash – and working with the College of Charleston and MUSC as they implement their student housing plans. We are actively pursuing underground wiring projects and sponsor trash pick-ups every month.
